Nov. 16: Night Out for the Homeless

It was dark. It was cold. Try as she might, Alana DeHart, our secretary, couldn't get to sleep. She thought about what it must be like for people who don't have the choices she has. People who HAVE to sleep outside because they are homeless.

Earlier that evening, at the Montco SLEEP Out at the courthouse in Norristown, she had listened to speakers talk about homelessness and how it is "not a condition of a lack of willpower, it's not an expression of laziness, but it's due to a callousness of the heart."

County Commissioner Jamila Winder, State Rep. Greg Scott, Macedonia Ministries pastor Byron Craig, and others — talked about how people wring their hands and say "how awful," but they don't want to do anything about it.continued on Page 3








Our reading/literacy project

Our branch's Road to Reading project is already impressive. As of Nov. 20, one month since we signed our fiscal sponsor agreement with the Literacy Council of Norristown, we have distributed 1173 books to 7 organizations in Pottstown. The plan is to keep those groups — and others — supplied with books for children ages birth to 8 years. These books are gifts, not library supplies. Most are new. The recipients include: Pottstown School District, Salvation Army family shelter, Centro Cultural Latinos Unidos, WIC (Women, Infants and Children nutritional program), Kingdom Life Daycare, Head Start classes, St.Paul's Diaper Exchange.
